

THE NATIONAL SEAFOOD INDUSTRY TRAINING PACKAGE SFI04 INCORPORATING
CERTIFICATE OF COMPETENCY AS
COXSWAIN

The Northern Territory Marine Act requires that persons in charge of vessels in NT waters meet prescribed certification requirements.

The Certificate

The Coxswain certificate allows the holder to be the master of vessels up to 12 metres in waters up to 15 nautical miles seaward of the coast. It does not have to be periodically reviewed as it is valid in perpetuity and is recognised nationally.

Documented evidence of at least 12 months approved sea service in small vessels must be presented and approved by Marine Safety Branch in order to sit the exam. **(Copy of letter from Marine Safety Branch stating eligibility must be given to SMIT administration when enrolling)** Please contact the NT Marine Safety Branch – 2nd floor, Energy House, 18 Cavenagh St., Darwin NT, phone 08 89247100, fax 08 89247009.

The Program

The Coxswain program runs for 2.5 weeks full-time including 3 day Coxswain engineering, which incorporates both theoretical and practical elements.

Program content & training comply with SITP Training package & TDM training package (Certificate III)

Additional courses need to be completed before issue of Certificate of competency as Coxswain from Marine Safety Branch. These include:

1. M.R.O.C.P. (Marine Radio) 2 days
2. Elements of Shipboard Safety :
 - Senior First Aid 2 days
 - Fire Fighting 1 day
 - Personal Survival Technique 2 days

NOTE: All certificates (ESS - *apply* first aid, personal survival technique, fire fighting & Radio) can be collected approximately 2 ~ 3 weeks after completion of programs & full payment of fees is received.

TDMMF4702A	Contribute to maintaining a safe watch on a domestic vessel
TDMMR5402A	Carry out refuelling and fuel transfer operations
TDMME101A	Understand orders and be understood in relation to shipboard duties
TDMMC1001B	Steer a domestic vessel under the direction of the master or officer in charge of the watch
TDMLL201A	Contribute to effective human relationship on board a vessel
