

THE NATIONAL SEAFOOD INDUSTRY TRAINING PACKAGE SFI 04 INCORPORATING UNITS PREVIOUSLY KNOWN AS

ELEMENTS OF SHIPBOARD SAFETY (ESS)

The Northern Territory Marine Act requires that persons in charge of vessels in NT waters meet prescribed certification requirements. The Elements of Shipboard Safety Certificate are covered by:

- Basic Fire Fighting on Board a Vessel 1 day
Facilitated & assessed by *Accrete Pty Ltd*
- Personal Survival Technique (inclusive OHS) 2 days*
This is an AMSA approved course (STCW '95) in accordance with IMO model course 1.19
**** Candidate is required to download the course pre-reading materials from our website and bring along to class.**
- Apply First Aid (**Satisfies Elementary First Aid**) 2 days
Facilitated & assessed by St John Ambulance Australia

* Candidates who are not enrolled with our organisation but have completed all of the above may apply for an Elements of Shipboard Safety certificate, subject to Marine Safety Branch approval.

- The 1 day Basic Fire Fighting has **no RPL granted by AMSA** for the application of AMSA Safety Certificate (previously called STCW '95). Candidate is required to complete the 3 day **Fire Fighting with Breathing Apparatus** with AMSA accredited training organisation directly.
